Bennett Jordan, Ph.D., National Pest Management Association, Fairfax, VA Technicians and other field personnel are frequently called upon to identify wood destroying beetles and their damage in the field. Phil Koehler, Ph.D., University of Florida, Gainesville, FL

Insect light traps are one of the most common methods of fly control by PMPs. Light traps are effective in attracting and catching flies only if they are placed and used properly. This presentation will address factors that affect fly catch in light traps, like placement height, air currents, bulb selection, bulb replacement, competing light sources, and light quality/quantity. Other methods of developing a total fly IPM program will also be discussed.

Mike Weyman, Clemson University, Clemson, S.C.


